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Introduction

Productivity, joyousness, kindness, honesty, fortitude, good decisions, nonviolence, respectful talk.... these and others are the qualities that make lives better. These are the habits I refer to as "psychological skills."

How do young children learn these psychological skills? The models, the examples they see, are very important. And part of the way that children get positive models is through stories. The young child needs many, many concrete examples of all psychological skills. The more positive examples are stored in the child's memory bank, the more those positive patterns will be available when the child makes choices about what to do.


The stories in this book are meant to be positive models. Almost all of them are without violence and without "villains." They are constructed with the psychological development of young children as the first priority, and with entertainment value as second priority. Yet it has been very gratifying to me how many children have enjoyed these stories greatly, and have wanted to hear them over and over. This is especially true when the stories are read with great enthusiasm and energy. I hope that they will provide many hours of pleasant time for an adult and a child sitting and reading together.


It's also fun to use these stories in classrooms. You can put them on overhead transparencies and read them to a group of children. Sometimes the children enjoy answering the question, "What did someone do that was smart or good in that story?"


Another fun way to use these stories with groups of children is to act them out. You pick someone to be each character. Someone reads the story, stopping after each panel to let the actors act out what was just read. Alternatively, you read the whole story and then act it out, without refreshing the memory about what happens next.

Another way to use these stories is as models for "homemade modeling stories" that you create. When a child does something smart or good or imitation-worthy, you write down the story of what happened, with a sentence or two on each page. You draw some pictures or let the child draw some pictures to illustrate. You staple the story down the sides, and you now have another illustrated modeling story. A growing pile of homemade illustrated modeling stories is a great gift to any child, from parent or teacher.



When they got home, Larry told his mother and father what Joe had done. Their father smiled at Joe and said, "That must have been a heavy load, Joe."








James Lind Does An Experiment

People with scurvy would have their gums swell and get very sore. They would get purple bruises all over their bodies.




They would feel weak and tired. Their legs would swell. Old scars would open and bleed. Very many people died of this disease.




No one knew what caused it or how to get it better. In the year 1747 a man named James Lind was on a ship. His job was to take care of the sick men.




James Lind read about different things that other people thought might help people with scurvy. Some people thought that vinegar would help. Some people said to drink sea water.



Some people thought that the best thing was a paste mixed up from all sorts of other stuff. Someone else claimed that lemons and limes and oranges would be best.




James Lind got the idea to do an experiment. In an experiment, you try out things and see what happens. He first made sure that the men in his experiment got the same thing to eat each day.

Then he gave vinegar to some of them and salt water to some of them.




He gave the paste to some of them and he gave oranges and lemons to some of them. He tried other things with still others of them.

But the ones who had gotten the oranges and lemons had gotten well! They felt so good that they could get up and work and try to help the other men.




James Lind wrote down what had happened in his experiment, so that other people could know about it. He wrote down that oranges and lemons were the best way to get people better when they have scurvy.

James Lind Does An Experiment



The man stopped so that he and the dogs could rest. He let the dogs run loose.



She began to feel very cramped and restless. She had to get up to stretch. Then she reminded herself that it would take practice to do what she wanted to do.




She thought of how much she wanted to watch the animals. She thought, "I may have to put up with being uncomfortable if I want to watch them."

Hal said, "Here is your answer." Hal danced a little dance all around the floor.




So, Marilyn said, "Hey Charlotte, I'm going for a walk. Do you want to come with me?"

The driver covered the seats, and Harry and King got in. The driver went straight to the vet's office.



"Or I could go to the meet and not do my homework. If I did that, I would feel bad tomorrow when I hadn't done my work.




"If I try to go to the meet and do my homework, I might be very sleepy tomorrow, but I can go to bed early tomorrow night.

So, Gina did as she decided. When she got home, she was sleepy, but she stayed awake and finished her homework. It was hard to get up the next morning.






The deer got so used to Alex that they would eat out of Alex's hand and let him rub their fuzzy noses.


"If I had had a wife and children at that time, they would have been in danger, so I didn't have a family then. I stayed pretty much to myself. I even kept the place where I lived a secret.




"I didn't like going out of town and leaving them. I worried about them until I learned to trust you. You took good care of them, as well as I did, and you always kept the secret."





One day, Patty's family came back to visit. Jean and Patty were able to see each other again. They hugged each other and spent a long time talking and laughing.



"It's not so hard," Frank said. "I enjoy it more when people can eat together."


Zane said, "I've never seen anybody with such self-discipline! Now I know why you're such a good runner."


Freddy's father said, "That is why I didn't want you to go over and play in that area, Freddy. They use explosives around here, and that thing you were looking at is called a blasting cap."

After the game was over, the little boy was still watching them.


James thought he looked interested in the basketball, so he offered the ball to the little boy and said, "Do you want to try it?"

James said, "Hmm, that's a little hard for someone your size. Here, let's see if you can do this instead." James took an old can that someone had left lying around and set it on top of a little wall.




James said, "Let's see if you can throw the ball and knock the can off the wall -- like this." And James threw the ball to knock the can off.




Then the little boy took the basketball and threw it at the can. The second time he tried, he knocked the can off. And James clapped for him and said, "Hooray! You did it!"

George and the One-Way Street




One time a boy named George was about to walk over to a friend's house across the street.



The street they lived on was a oneway street, so cars came from only one direction. George looked in that direction and saw that no cars were coming, so he started to run across the street.




But then he said to himself, "Wait a minute. Let me stop and think. I'd better stay in the habit of looking both ways."

But then he thought to himself, "Wait a minute, let me think about this. Maybe he's trying to help me or maybe he needs help. I'll stop and see what he wants."



She also had been up late the night before, studying for a test. And she also felt grumpy, because someone had said some things to her that weren't nice.



She watched him running around sniffing everything. She was glad she had taken him out. She loved to see him having fun.




Judy thought to herself, "He needs to run more. How can I let him do that?" Then Judy got an idea.

Peter's grandmother lived with him and his family. Ever since Peter was a baby, his grandmother had done nice things for him.




She had taken him outside in his stroller. When he had learned to walk, she had taken him to the park. She had watched him while he walked around.



He very gently took the oatmeal box from her hand and put the box of soap in its place.






She said, "Yes," and he led her to the refrigerator and opened it for her. He watched to make sure that she found the orange juice, and gave her a cup for her to pour herself some.



Another time, she was talking about someone who had been dead for a long time. She seemed worried that this person wouldn't have enough money to take care of himself.




No matter what anybody said, she worried. Peter said to himself, "I'll bet I can get the worrying out of her mind by singing some songs for her." So he did, and it worked.


A boy was interested in archery. He wanted to save his money to buy a bow and arrows.


The friend laughed too, because he knew the boy wouldn't really shoot him.


The boy knew his father was right. The boy felt very ashamed of himself, because he knew that he could have accidentally let go and hurt his friend.




The boy was very disappointed. He enjoyed the archery very much, but he decided that he could put up with not being able to shoot.


Months passed. One day his father said to him. "Please come with me, son." They went to a closet, and his father took out the bow and arrows.







The boy was thankful that his father cared enough about him to teach him to use the bow and arrows safely.





Ted watched for a very long time. He figured out that the men moved differently. Some moved straight ahead, and others moved diagonally.





One day some travelers came through town. They heard that the boy was an expert at putting up with his parents' paying attention to someone else. They decided to go and see for themselves.




The travelers went to the boy's house. They said to his parents, "Please, we have come to see the boy who can put up with his parents' paying attention to something else. May we visit you for a while?"



The boy's mother and father invited the travelers to come in. They sat down and talked with the travelers.





The toy people did some very interesting things.






The Boy Learns About Champions' Mistakes

When he did this, he would feel bad and want to quit trying to read. He would say, "I want to do something else."






Or when he was playing the piano, often he would play the wrong notes. He would think, "That sounded terrible. I'll watch TV instead."




One day the boy was walking in his neighborhood and he saw his friend, the Amazing Person.



The Amazing Person was just finishing an invention made out of recycled televisions, computers and telescopes. The boy said, "Hi, Amazing Person. What are you finishing now?"




The Amazing Person said, "It's a great device. It allows you to capture light rays that went hurling off into space a long time ago and see things that happened back then.

"It lets you see the past in the present! There are probably all sorts of problems that this machine will solve. Just name a problem, and we'll see if it can solve it!"





The boy said, "Yes."




All of a sudden, there came onto the screen a movie of a famous diving champion, practicing diving! The Amazing Person said, "Well, we almost got it. But let's see what this is."


But the diving champion got out of the water and talked to his coach. All his coach said was, "Do you know what to do differently next time?"




The champion nodded and said, "Yes, I need to stay tucked in a ball longer." The coach said, "Rehearse it in your mind a few times before you try again."



The champion stood on the board and concentrated for a while. He was picturing in his mind what he would do.




The next time, the diving champion went a little too far in the other direction. This time he almost flopped over onto his back. The boy said, "This just isn't his day. Maybe he should try it another day.




But the champion got up and practiced in his mind again, and he tried the dive again. And he kept on and on and on.






But the very first dive that the champion did, he walked out to the end of the board just to test the springiness of the board. He jumped up and down a couple of times and lost his balance.




"But each time he made one, he would try to rehearse in his mind how to do it better the next time, and would try it again."


"He did better on the math test than anyone else in the whole state! He made up lots of math ideas that were useful to lots of people, too, and he published it in an article!"


When she finally stayed on well, she had a big smile on her face.



And they saw a pair of champion figure skaters practicing. They knocked each other over a few times and both landed on the ice. But then they talked about how to do it better the next time, and they tried again.




When they finally did it well, they were so happy that they hugged each other.




The boy said, "Thanks, Amazing Person. I think I learned something important from this. I think I'm going to go home and practice some of the things I've been learning. What are you going to do?"



The amazing person said, "Let's tune in on a soccer player. Here he is practicing running and kicking the ball. As you can see, he makes lots of mistakes.





The boy could see that the Amazing person felt good, and the boy felt good too.




Cindy and the Scary Bedtime Problem

One morning, Cindy's mother said to her, "Cindy, you're going to need to figure out a way to sleep in your own room. I hope you can do it."




"Try to stay in your own room at night. Each time you come out of your room, we'll put an X on the chart and just take you back to your bed. We won't talk to you."


Mr. James said, "Hi, Cindy! I don't have a free hand, so I'll wave to you with my foot."


By the time Cindy said good-bye to Mr. James, she had decided that she knew how to do what she wanted to do.


They sat down to have a chat. Cindy said, "Mr. Robber, why do you like to rob people?"


Cindy said, "Well, that's no problem. I'll give you something to eat. Come on." The makebelieve robber looked happy to hear this.

Then she taught the robber to say the blessing.




Cindy gave him some strawberry shortcake. Then she said, "If you eat all your strawberry shortcake, you get to have some spinach and mushrooms!"

Then Cindy fixed him another very favorite food of his, which was a vanilla milk shake with a little bit of mashed potatoes mixed in with it!




Cindy said to him, "You can have this here, but you must remember not to order it in a restaurant.

People will think you're strange if you do." The robber was interested to hear this, and he made a note of it in his notebook.




It was getting to be the robber's bedtime. But before he left, Cindy said to him, "I have a present for you before you go." And she gave him a magic pot of dirt and some seeds.

The robber thanked Cindy. Then he said, "I have a present for you, Cindy. It's a picture of me with my family."




Cindy said good-bye to the makebelieve robber. And that was the end of the first story.

After a while, Cindy went back inside and lay on her bed again. Now a new story came into her mind. It was called, "Cindy Meets the Skeleton and the Giant Bird."




In this story, Cindy said, "I'm going into my dreamland and meet a giant bird and a skeleton. Who wants to go with me? I'll need good friends."

He said, "I used to be a robber, but now you can call me Ex-robber."





So when all was safe, the giant bird took Cindy and flew out over the lake. Cindy got a great view.




Just at the right spot, the giant bird dropped Cindy into the lake. Cindy shouted out, "Whee!" as she dropped through the air. She did a flip on the way down.




The water was nice and warm. Cindy yelled out, "Thanks, Giant Bird." The giant bird gave her friends a nice ride out into the lake, too.

The person in the skeleton suit said, "Thank you. That would be great!"




Cindy said, "Out of all these friends, maybe one of us knows something about doctoring sick animals."

So the giant bird took them all to where she lived.




The baby giant bird was lying in bed. The ex-robber did some doctoring and Cindy and the rest of her friends helped out.


When bedtime came, Cindy kissed her father and mother goodnight. They told her again about the chart, even though she remembered it perfectly.




Cindy went outside and rode her bike some more. She went to play with some real-life friends.



When Cindy went to bed, she was excited, but she wasn't very scared. She lay on her bed, closed her eyes, and started making up stories about her make-believe friends.






After a while, the story turned into a good dream and Cindy slept.




The next morning when Cindy came to breakfast, there was a big star on the chart. Her mother and father were cheering for her.

Appendix: Using These Stories to Teach Sixteen Skills and Principles

It is very useful for a child to learn the vocabulary of psychological skills. Learning these words helps the child classify situations by what skill the situation calls for, and to be more organized in gaining access to their own repertoire of positive coping skills. Below is a list of sixteen skills and principles that make up mental health, with a short definition of each. For each story in this book, after the child reads it, the child can practice deciding which of two skills the story gives a more prominent example of. Many of the stories give examples of more than one skill. In the pairs of skills for each story that I have furnished as questions, I've tried to contrast one skill that the story does illustrate with one that the story does not particularly illustrate. You phase the question, for example, "Do you think that this story gives an example of honesty, or fortitude?"

Of course, before asking such questions, you have to teach the child what the words mean. If you want to use the stories to do this, you may say things like, "This story was an example of honesty. It was honest of her to give the money back rather than keep it for herself." Or: this story is an example of friendship-building. He made friends with the other boy when he came up and started talking with him and started playing with him." Then when you go back and read the story again, you can perhaps ask the question rather than say the answer.

Another of many steps in teaching these principles is to observe the child's reallife behavior, to note the positive examples, and to refer to them by these words, as in "Hey, nice productivity!" and "I know you wanted that, but you couldn't get it. You handled it well! You used some good fortitude skills!"

Here are the sixteen skills and principles:

- 1. Work hard. (productivity)
- 2. Be cheerful. (joyousness)
- 3. Be kind. Make people happy. (kindness)
- 4. Tell the truth. (honesty)
- 5. When you don't get what you want, handle it. (fortitude)

- 6. Think carefully about what to do. (good decisions) Talk calmly when you don't agree with someone. (good decisions, conflict-resolution)
- 7. Don't hurt or kill. (nonviolence)
- 8. Don't use hurtful talk. (respectful talk, not being rude)
- 9. Build good relations with people. (friendship building)
- 10. Choose long term goals over short-term pleasure. (self-discipline)
- 11. Stick by people who have been good to you. (loyalty)
- 12. Don't waste the earth's resources. (conservation)
- 13. Take care of yourself. (self-care)
- 14. Obey when it is good and right to obey. (compliance)
- 15. In your fantasy, practice doing good things. Don't have fun pretending people are hurt. (positive fantasy rehearsal)
- 16. Be brave enough to do what's best. (courage)
